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
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Introduction

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1.1 Overview

The GRAND-AL is powered by an Intel® Celeron® J3455 quad-core 1.5 GHz processor and up to 8 GB DDR3L memory. The GRAND-AL provides four, eight, or twelve hot-swappable SATA drive bays that support both hard disk drives and solid-state drives. The GRAND-AL also features four gigabit Ethernet ports, four USB 3.0 ports, one HDMI port, and one PCIe 2.0 x2 slot for various applications and expansion options.

The GRAND-AL has the following features







Installation

3.1 Anti-static Precautions



Failure to take ESD precautions during the maintenance of the GRAND-AL may result in permanent damage to the GRAND-AL and severe injury to the user.

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Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can cause serious damage to electronic components, including the WAFER series motherboard and the power module. (Dry climates are especially susceptible to ESD.) It is therefore critical that whenever the GRAND-AL is opened and any electrical component handled, the following anti-static precautions are strictly adhered to.

- Wear an anti-static wristband: Wearing a simple anti-static wristband can help to prevent ESD from damaging the board.
- Self-grounding: Before handling the board, touch any grounded conducting material. During the time the board is handled, frequently touch any conducting materials that are connected to the ground.
- Use an anti-static pad: When configuring the GRAND-AL, place it on an anti-static pad. This reduces the possibility of ESD damaging the GRAND-AL.

3.2 Installation Precautions

During installation, be aware of the precautions below:

- Read the user manual: The user manual provides a complete description of the GRAND-AL, installation instructions and configuration options.
- DANGER! Disconnect Power: Power to the GRAND-AL must be disconnected during the installation process. Failing to disconnect the power may cause severe injury to the body and/or damage to the system.
- Qualified Personnel: The GRAND-AL must be installed and operated only by trained and qualified personnel. Maintenance, upgrades, or repairs may only




be carried out by qualified personnel who are familiar with the associated dangers.

- Air Circulation: Make sure there is sufficient air circulation when installing the GRAND-AL. The GRAND-AL's cooling vents must not be obstructed by any objects. Blocking the vents can cause overheating of the GRAND-AL. Leave at least 5 cm of clearance around the GRAND-AL to prevent overheating.
- Grounding: The GRAND-AL should be properly grounded. The voltage feeds must not be overloaded. Adjust the cabling and provide external overcharge protection per the electrical values indicated on the label attached to the back of the GRAND-AL.

3.3 Memory Module Installation


The GRAND-AL has two memory slots and supports DDR3L SO-DIMMs. To install a memory module, follow the steps below:

- **Step 1:** Turn off the GRAND-AL. Disconnect the power adaptor, network cable(s), and any other connectors or cables from the GRAND-AL.
- **Step 2:** Put on an antistatic wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge. The crocodile clip should be connected to the ground.
- Step 3: GRAND-AL-04A series: Remove the screws that secure the case cover to the chassis. Slide the case cover back. Pull the case cover up until it completely detaches from the chassis.






GRAND-AL-08B/12B series: Loosen the screws that secure the case cover to the chassis. Slide the case cover back. Pull the case cover up until it completely detaches from the chassis.



- **Step 4:** Grip a RAM on the edges to avoid touching contacts or circuitry on the module.
- Step 5: Slide the memory module to the slot at a 45-degree angle (approximately).Press the memory module down. Make sure the memory module sits in properly with the clips in place.



Step 6: Close the GRAND-AL cover and fasten the screws. Connect the power adaptor and cables back to the GRAND-AL.



3.4 Expansion Card Installation


The following instructions should only be performed by an authorized and trained technician.

Strictly adhere to the instructions to install a network expansion card on the system. Failure to do so could result in injury to human body or death.

The GRAND-AL provides one PCIe x2 expansion slot so that users can add functionality to their system. To install expansion card, follow the steps below.

3.4.1 GRAND-AL-04A Series

- **Step 1:** Turn off the GRAND-AL. Disconnect the power adaptor, network cable(s), and any other connectors or cables from the GRAND-AL.
- **Step 2:** Before installing the expansion card, put on an antistatic wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge. The crocodile clip should be connected to the ground.
- **Step 3:** Remove the screws that secure the case cover to the chassis. Slide the case cover back. Pull the case cover up until it completely detaches from the chassis.




Step 4: Remove the screws as shown below.



Step 5: Loose the screw and remove the bracket.



Step 6: Insert an expansion card to the riser card module until it cannot go any further. Then fasten the screw.





Step 7: Align the notch on the gold edge of the riser card with the notch in the PCIe slot. Insert the riser card module to the PCIe slot until it cannot go any further.



Step 8: Fasten the screws. Close the case cover and fasten the screws.




Step 9: Connect the power adaptor and cables to the GRAND-AL.


- **Step 1:** Turn off the GRAND-AL. Disconnect the power adaptor, network cable(s), and any other connectors or cables from the GRAND-AL.
- **Step 2:** Before installing the expansion card, put on an antistatic wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge. The crocodile clip should be connected to the ground.




3.5.2 Installing Hard Drive

- **Step 2:** Pull the handle to release the tray and pull the tray out.



Step 1: Connect the power source to the power input jack(s).




Figure 3-1: Power Connection








Figure 3-2: Power Button




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To replace a failed power supply unit, please follow the steps below.


- **Step 1:** Turn off the GRAND-AL. Disconnect the power adaptor, network cable(s), and any other connectors or cables from the GRAND-AL.

Step 3: Insert new power supply into the GRAND-AL.

- Step 5: Power on the system.




Figure 5-1: Connector Locations





B.1.2 Anti-static Precautions



Failure to take ESD precautions during the installation of the GRAND-AL may result in permanent damage to the GRAND-AL and severe injury to the user.

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can cause serious damage to electronic components, including the GRAND-AL. Dry climates are especially susceptible to ESD. It is therefore critical that whenever the GRAND-AL is opened and any of the electrical components are handled, the following anti-static precautions are strictly adhered to.


- Be cautious of all small removable components when vacuuming the GRAND-AL.
- Turn the GRAND-AL off before cleaning the GRAND-AL.
- Never drop any objects or liquids through the openings of the GRAND-AL.
- Be cautious of any possible allergic reactions to solvents or chemicals used when cleaning the GRAND-AL.
- Avoid eating, drinking and smoking within vicinity of the GRAND-AL.

B.2.2 Cleaning Tools

Some components in the GRAND-AL may only be cleaned using a product specifically designed for the purpose. In such case, the product will be explicitly mentioned in the cleaning tips. Below is a list of items to use when cleaning the GRAND-AL.

- Cloth Although paper towels or tissues can be used, a soft, clean piece of cloth is recommended when cleaning the GRAND-AL.
- Water or rubbing alcohol A cloth moistened with water or rubbing alcohol can be used to clean the GRAND-AL.
- Using solvents The use of solvents is not recommended when cleaning the GRAND-AL as they may damage the plastic parts.
- Vacuum cleaner Using a vacuum specifically designed for computers is one of the best methods of cleaning the GRAND-AL. Dust and dirt can restrict the airflow in the GRAND-AL and cause its circuitry to corrode.
- Cotton swabs Cotton swaps moistened with rubbing alcohol or water are excellent tools for wiping hard to reach areas.
- *Foam swabs* Whenever possible, it is best to use lint free swabs such as foam swabs for cleaning.
